

Oxygen Safety

Oxygen is a medication that should only be used as directed by your doctor.

DO NOT change the setting unless directed by your doctor.

DO NOT SMOKE WHILE USING OXYGEN or allow open flames or any smoking materials in the room where oxygen is being used or stored. This includes the use of electronic cigarettes. Additionally, batteries of electronic cigarettes should not be charged in the vicinity of the oxygen.

DO NOT use any household electric equipment while using oxygen (for example, electric razors, sweepers, and blankets). Keep these items at least five feet away from your oxygen.

DO NOT store oxygen containers in the closet. Oxygen cylinders must be secured in a stand or cart. NEVER allow cylinders to be free-standing.

DO NOT use flammable creams and lotions.

DO NOT use aerosol sprays in the vicinity of oxygen equipment.

DO NOT use oil, grease, or petroleum jelly on or near oxygen equipment.

Oxygen Safety

DO NOT allow oxygen tubing to be covered by any objects or rugs.

DO NOT leave oxygen on when equipment is not being used.

DO NOT abuse or handle oxygen containers roughly.

DO NOT allow untrained people to use or adjust equipment.

DO NOT attempt to fix or repair oxygen equipment.

DO NOT store oxygen containers near radiators, heat ducts, or other heat sources.

DO NOT touch frosted fittings or piping on liquid systems with bare hands.

Traveling with Oxygen

Place the oxygen unit upright. Place on the floor or the seat next to you and secure with a seatbelt.

DO NOT smoke or allow anyone else to smoke in the car.

DO open your window approximately one inch when transporting any oxygen.

DO contact your oxygen provider in advance if you are planning to travel or transport your oxygen.
